Foreign Athletes will be invited by the OC through their home NF.

**A. Open to following Foreign and German Athletes**

1. The 25 best Athletes acc. To the Rolex Rankings No. 124 (max. 5 per foreign nation).
2. All athletes placed 1<sup>st</sup> - 3<sup>rd</sup> in the Riders Tour Final Ranking 2010.
3. All athletes placed 1<sup>st</sup> - 5<sup>th</sup> in the last valid ranking list of the Riders Tour.

**B. Open to following remaining Foreign Athletes (up to a total number of approx. 20 foreign Athletes)**

1. The FEI has the right to nominate two foreign Athletes
2. Further foreign Athletes who are invited through their home NF up to a total number of approx. 20 (including competitors to A and B.1.):
  - 50 % of these Athletes must be selected from the top 300 of the Rolex Rankings No. 124
  - 50 % are free (ranked or unranked Athletes).
3. 15 % of all foreign CSI4\* Athletes may receive a wildcard, however these Athletes must be selected from the top 600 of the Rolex Rankings No. 124. 20 % of all foreign CSIYH1\* Athletes will receive a wildcard.

**C. Open to the following German Athletes (up to a total of approx. 25 German Athletes)**

Acc. to a special handicap agreed upon with NF GER.

**Number of horses per athlete:**

Each athlete may start a max. of 4 horses, thereof 2 horses in the CSIYH1\* (comp. No 1 – 3) and 2 horses in the CSI4\* (comp. No 4 – 10) or 1 horse in the CSIYH1\* (comp. No 1 – 3) and 3 horses in the CSI4\* (comp. No 4 – 10).

**D. Further German Athletes only for the Medium (CSI4\*) or Youngster Tour (CSIYH1\*) (comp. 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, 7 and 9)**

Up to 10 German athletes acc. to a special handicap agreed upon with NF GER.

For athletes only attending the Medium Tour/CSIYH1\*: max. 2 horses per athlete are allowed; one horse for the Medium Tour and one horse for the Youngster Tour or two horses for the Youngster Tour (CSIYH1\*).

Horses taking part in the CSIYH1\* are not allowed to take part in any other competition of the event.

CSI4\*: The number of German Athletes must not exceed 60 % of all Athletes.

The organiser draws up a list of all definitely starting athletes („masterlist“), classified according to the above criteria, which must be given to the German NF office, the Foreign Judge and the NF Delegate. Any alterations may only be done in mutual agreement before the event starts.

**VI. FACILITIES OFFERED**

**1. ATHLETES**

The organizer cannot guarantee any reservations that are made on a later date or by phone or which are made different from the way described beforehand.

Accommodation (overnight stay and breakfast) from 25<sup>th</sup> – 28<sup>th</sup> August, 2011 will be at the organizer's expense. Meals for competitors are available on the show ground.

**2. GROOMS**

Grooms receive free meals from 25<sup>th</sup> – 28<sup>th</sup> August, 2011 in a tent at the stable area. Sanitary and showering facilities for male and female grooms, with hot and cold water, will be provided by the OC.

**3. HORSES**

Horses will be stabled (incl. first bedding) from 25<sup>th</sup> – 28<sup>th</sup> August, 2011; the stabling fee is included in the entry fee. Boxes are available only for horses being started in the CSI-Event. Forage and mangers have to be brought along. A binding reservation for the number of boxes have to be handed in together with the entries. Additional boxes will be charged with 150,00 € (incl. VAT) and have to be ordered in advance. Boxes which have been ordered and cancelled after closing date of definite entries will be rendered to the Athlete's account by the OC. Electricity will be free of charge, but has to be ordered together with the entries.

The Athletes are authorised to carry the logo of their personal sponsor on the saddle cloth in accordance with Art. 135. The Chief Steward will check that the advertising and publicity on Athletes and horses complies with Article 135 of the General Regulations.

## **VIII. CUSTOMS FORMALITIES/HEALTH REQUIREMENTS**

### **1. CUSTOMS FORMALITIES**

Customs and veterinary fees will not be taken over by the OC. Per horse a fee of EUR 35,00 will be charged for handling the border formalities.

### **2. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ENTRY OF HORSES**

Every Athlete is supplied to deliver all necessary certificates of health for the transport to the event or identification of the horses before they come into the stables:

a) in case of arrival from a EU-member-country, a certificate for registered horses acc. to sample of Annex B to Regulations 90/426 of the actual valid form will be necessary.

b) in case of arrival from a country not concerning to the EU, a certificate of health for registered horses acc. to sample of annex II of the decision of the commission 92/260 of the actual valid form will be necessary.

A certificate must be done in at least one official language of the country of destination and in one official language of the member country. The Athlete must carry with him the original certificate, not a copy.

The organiser sees to it that on the competition site, an official state veterinarian is present to issue the health certificates which are necessary for the transport of the horses to their destination abroad.

In case the OC has entrusted to a forwarding agency, the latter is ready to assist regarding the required documents.

Furthermore, questions relating to health requirements for horses can be directed to the veterinary authorities in the country of origin or in Germany.

### **3. VETERINARY ASPECTS "A"**

VETERINARY REGULATIONS, 12<sup>th</sup> Edition 2010, updates effective 1<sup>st</sup> January 2011  
VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS, HORSE INSPECTIONS & PASSPORT CONTROLS

These will be carried out in accordance with the "Veterinary Regulations", Art. 1011 & the discipline rules.

"General Regulations", 23<sup>rd</sup> edition, effective 1<sup>st</sup> January 2009, updates effective 1<sup>st</sup> January 2011:

Passports Art. 137.1

1. Every horse entered for any competition at CNs or CIMs (see Appendix E) and in CSI-P and CSI-Ch-A in a country other than the country of the horse's nationality, and all horses entered for other CIs, CIOs, FEI Championships, Regional, Olympic Games and Paralympic Games, whether at home or away from the country of its nationality (see Art. 139.2), must have an official, valid FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI and accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card and, when applicable, an FEI registration number, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

2. Horses taking part in CNs and CIMs (see Appendix E) and in CSI-P and CSI-Ch-A in their country of nationality are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered with the FEI and identifiable and, unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION, VET. REGS. ANNEX VII

(except events taking place in NZL & AUS)

From 1<sup>st</sup> January 2005 onwards, influenza vaccination for all horses competing in FEI competitions requires a vaccination within six months + 21 days of the competition.

1. All horses intending to participate in FEI competitions must have at least received an initial primary course of two vaccinations, given between 21 and 92 days apart. Thereafter, a third dose (referred to as the first booster) must be given within 7 months after the date to administration of the second primary dose, with the least annual boosters given subsequently (i. e. within one year of the last dose).

2. If the horse is scheduled to take part in an FEI competition, the last booster must have been given within 6 months + 21 days of arrival at the FEI event. (The 21-day window has been provided to enable vaccination requirements to fit in with the competition schedule).

3. No vaccination shall be given within 7 days of the day of arrival at the FEI event.

4. All horses that were certified as correctly vaccinated under the previous FEI equine influenza vaccination rule prior to 1<sup>st</sup> January 2005, do not need to start a primary course and annual re-vaccinations and the new rule of a booster vaccination within 6 months + 21 days of the day of arrival at the FEI event.

SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES

(Vet. Regs. Chapter V & VI and Annex IV)

Regular sampling is carried out in CSIs/CDI (3\*, 4\*, 5\*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. When testing takes place, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate. At CCI3\* and CCI4\*, CSIs (3\*, 4\*, 5\*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifier and Cup Finals, Championships and Games it is recommended that a minimum of 5 % of all horses (with a minimum of 3 horses tested) must be sampled (see also VR Art. 1016.5).

Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Groups I & II only).

MEDICATION CONTROL PROGRAMME (GROUP I & II ONLY)

The Organising Committees of FEI events within Groups I & II are advised to charge Athletes the equivalent of CHF 12.50 per horse per event as a contribution towards the costs of the MCP programme.

MEDICATION CONTROL LABORATORY

**X. MISCELLANEOUS**

**1. PROTESTS**

All protests to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- or equivalent.

**2. GENERAL CLASSIFICATION AT THE END OF THE COMPETITIONS – SPECIAL PRIZES**

**Prize of “Stadt Münster”**

Special prize for the most successful rider of the “Turnier der Sieger 2011”

1<sup>st</sup> prize: gold bar to the value of 10.000,00 €; 2<sup>nd</sup> prize: gold bar to the value of 5.000,00 €; 3<sup>rd</sup> prize: gold bar to the value of 2.500,00 €.

The following competitions will count for the above mentioned prize: 4,5,6,7,8,9 and 10:

Point system:

Competitions no. 4 – 9:

Winner = 20 points, runner-up = 18 points; 3<sup>rd</sup> place = 16 points etc. 10<sup>th</sup> place = 2 points.

Competition no. 10:

Winner = 30 points; runner-up = 27 points; 3<sup>rd</sup> place = 24 points etc. 10<sup>th</sup> place = 3 points.

If two or more competitors have obtained the same number of points, the competitor with the better placing in comp. no. 10 is the winner of the special prize. Throughout the CSI (Turnier der Sieger) the competitors with the highest number of points has to wear an armlet, which after each competition which counts for the rating has to be handed over to the new leading competitor. The winner of the “Preis der Stadt Münster” may keep the armlet.

**Special prize of the “Juwelier Oeding-Erdel”**

for the most successful lady rider of the “Turnier der Sieger 2011”

The rating will be analogous to the “Preis der Stadt Münster” for the most successful jumping rider.

**3. PRIZE-GIVING CEREMONY**

Athletes placed 1<sup>st</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> are obliged to take part in the prize giving ceremonies, unless the OC gives another order during the event.

The owner of the winning horse is invited to the prize giving ceremony for the Grand Prix (comp. 10).

**4. DISTRIBUTION OF PRIZES AND INDEMNITIES**

All prize money and all prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money as well as reimbursements (e. g. transport charges, travelling expenses) will be distributed acc. to FEI-RG Art. 127/128 following the last competition at the latest to all Athletes **not living** in Germany. Athletes living in Germany will receive their account after the event by mail.

Settlement will be done with the athlete (disregarding any agreements between athlete and proprietor), thus the OC will be disburdened. The organizer is allowed to deduct possibly outstanding debts of the athlete. Acc. to § 50a EstG this also applies to foreign horse owners. After having deducted the turnover tax from the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money, as a rule the following income tax will be due: no taxes up to 250 EUR, 15 % exceeding 250 EUR (in force as of 01.01.2009); plus solidarity fee (at present 5.5 %) of the income tax amount. Travelling expenses being taken over or reimbursed are only regarded as revenues if they exceed the actual costs and the reimbursement for additional meal allowances acc. to § 4 Abs. 5 Satz 1 Nr. 5 EstG. The tax deduction has to be certified on demand. Those foreign Athletes being exempted from tax deduction are kindly asked to submit an exemption certificate either with the entry or on the first show day at the latest. Every Athlete himself is responsible for the correctness of the details he submits.

**5. INSURANCES**

All owners and athletes are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

**6. LIABILITY**

The organizer declines any liability for property or pecuniary damage which may happen to visitors, Athletes, grooms and horse owners through slight negligence of the organizer, his delegates or his assistants. The OC is liable in case of intent, gross negligence as well as in case of injury to life, body or health and in further cases he is liable for compelling legal liability acc. to the legal requirements. Furthermore he also declines any liability for theft or other incidents.

**7. EVENT'S ORGANISATION**

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Delegate of the NF GER and Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matter or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all Athletes and officials as soon as possible and must be reported to the FEI Jumping Department by the Foreign Judge.

**8. ENTRY RIGHT TO SHOWGROUNDS**

Athletes, grooms and horse owners of the participating horses will receive free entrance (per Athlete one groom and per horse two horse owners, acc. to the FEI passport). Entry right to the stable area acc. to VR Art. 1005.2.5.

Closing time of declaration for all competitions will be at 6.00 p.m. of the previous day, unless another closing time has been fixed for single competitions.

**14. PARTICIPATING HORSES**

have to wear the identification numbers whenever they leave the stables.

**15. Dogs**

have to be kept on the lead without fail on the whole show grounds.

**16. DISPUTES**

In the event of any discussion concerning the interpretation of the schedule (in translated languages), the English version will be decisive.

**THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT**

**FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE**

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
